Course Outline	The course is aimed to deepen the legal order that regulates individual and collective working relationships and job market.
Goals and expected results of the course	Students will gain a systematic knowledge of Labor Law, in regulatory, doctrinal and jurisprudence aspects, in a national and European dimension. They will develop new skills in legislation applying to enterprise, job market and regulating working relationships. Students will be able to research and use sources of law; to interpret legal texts and apply them to actual cases. The course encourages student's ability to identify the main forms of legal business organization and the kind of legal relation between employer and worker.
Course Syllabus	The main subjects of the course are: source of Labor Law; employment contract; Trade unions and the Constitution; worker's obligations and employer's powers; professionalism of the workers; safety in the workplaces; salary; termination employment contract; outsourced work; contract types; layoff; means of reemployment toward workers; discrimination at work.
Required effort (estimate average) for self-study	The amount of study required depends on subjective skills. The program requires about 150 hours of self-study (estimate average).
Teaching Method	The course consists of classroom lessons with student's active presence. There will also be seminars on specific topics by university professors and professional experts.

 Students will have to consult normative sources, contractual agreements and jurisprudential cases.
 The Professor can choose other learning resources during the course.

Support Activities
 The Professor provides support activities during office hours.

Attendances Modes
 The attendance modes are set out in the Teaching Regulation of the University. Attendance in this course isn't mandatory.

Evaluation Method
 The evaluation method is set out in the Teaching Regulation of the University, art. 22.
 There is usually not a midterm test.
 The Professor can check the progress of the class during the course on the basis of the number of attending students and teaching performances.
 The final exam will be held in the form of oral and provides an evaluation in thirtieths; the exam is passed with a mark equal or greater than 18/30. The vote is given to the student proportionally to his preparation and his performance, according to the table below.
